



Mandatory Recycling for Business in Collier County - Ordinance 2009-56 Non-Residential Property

Non-residential property owners

- Did you know that if you own non-residential property that recycling is mandatory?
- A non-residential property owner in Collier County is required to provide recycling containers on their property to ensure their tenants recycle.
- Property owners, work with your tenants to determine the waste streams they generate. Then, determine what can be recycled, such as cardboard, aluminum, office paper, magazines, glass (green, clear and brown), plastics numbered 1 through 7, newspaper, junk mail, and plastic bags.
- The collection of non-residential recycling in Collier County is a free market – you may contract with the hauler of your choice for recycling collection services.

Business owners

- Did you know that if you own and operate a business in Collier County that recycling is mandatory?
- As a generator of waste, your business should consider all of the items that you throw away and what materials can be recycled.
- Business owners, work with your employees to determine the waste stream your business generates. Then, determine what can be recycled, such as cardboard, aluminum, office paper, magazines, glass (green, clear and brown), plastics numbered 1 through 7, newspaper, junk mail, and plastic bags.
- The collection of business recycling in Collier County is a free market – you may contract with the hauler of your choice for recycling collection services.
